

What's your top barrier to IT/OT convergence?

Barrier 1 - Security



46% of manufacturers cite security concerns as the top barrier.

- Replace shared logins with individual authentication
- Ensure visibility of "who, when, where" for all access
- Align IT/OT teams around security + uptime goals

Barrier 2 - Legacy infrastructure



Nearly 50% of manufacturers have OT assets that are 15+ years old.

- Extend consistent authentication across both old and new systems
- Simplify logins to reduce downtime across shifts
- Strategic access management to bridge legacy OT and modern IT environments

Barrier 3 — Lack of real-time data



Only 30% of manufacturers deliver real-time data to frontline workers.

- Streamline training access to reduce certification delays
- Provide consistent login experiences across devices
- Strategic access management to deliver secure, instant data access

Barrier 4 – Low cybersecurity maturity



Just 15% of manufacturers have robust cybersecurity practices.

- Automate access policies to enforce least privilege
- Improve audit readiness with complete activity logs
- Pair strategic access management with secure hardware and backup solutions
