The Awareness Gap

Agencies understand the importance of CJIS compliance and their requirements, but awareness doesn't equal full execution. The challenge is operationalizing compliance across people, devices, systems, and workflows.

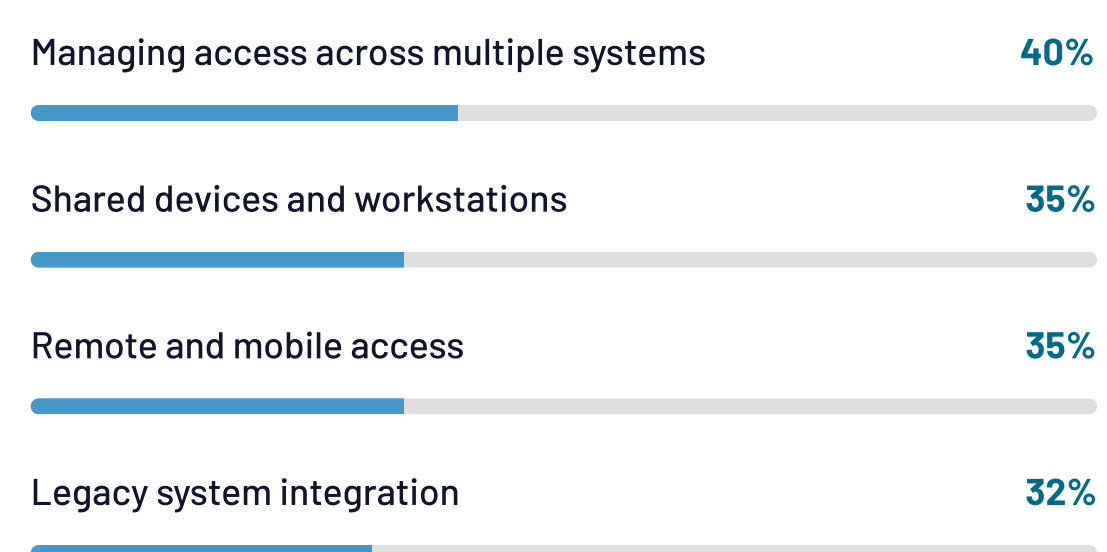
The Identity & Access Challenge

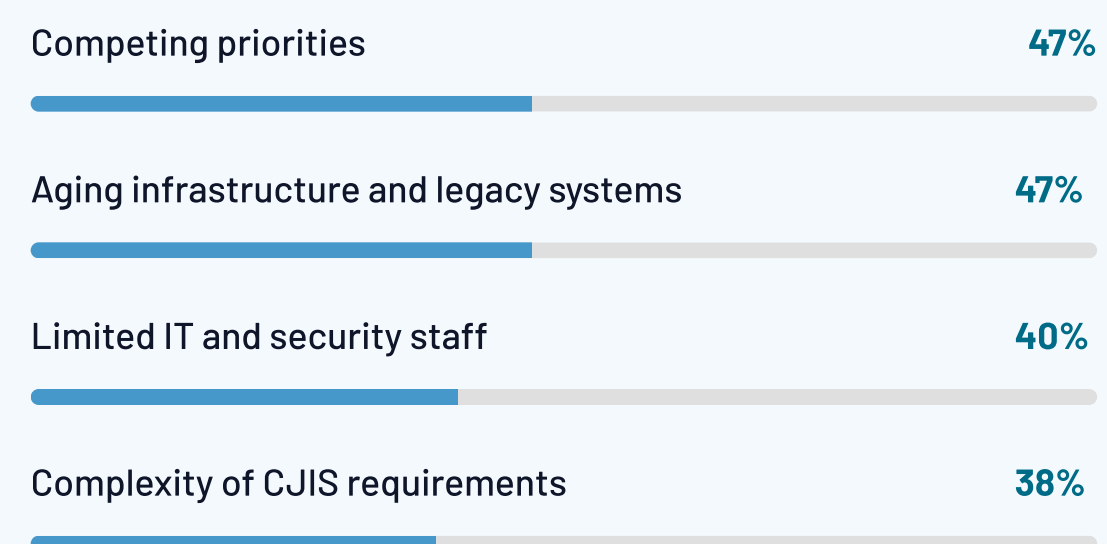

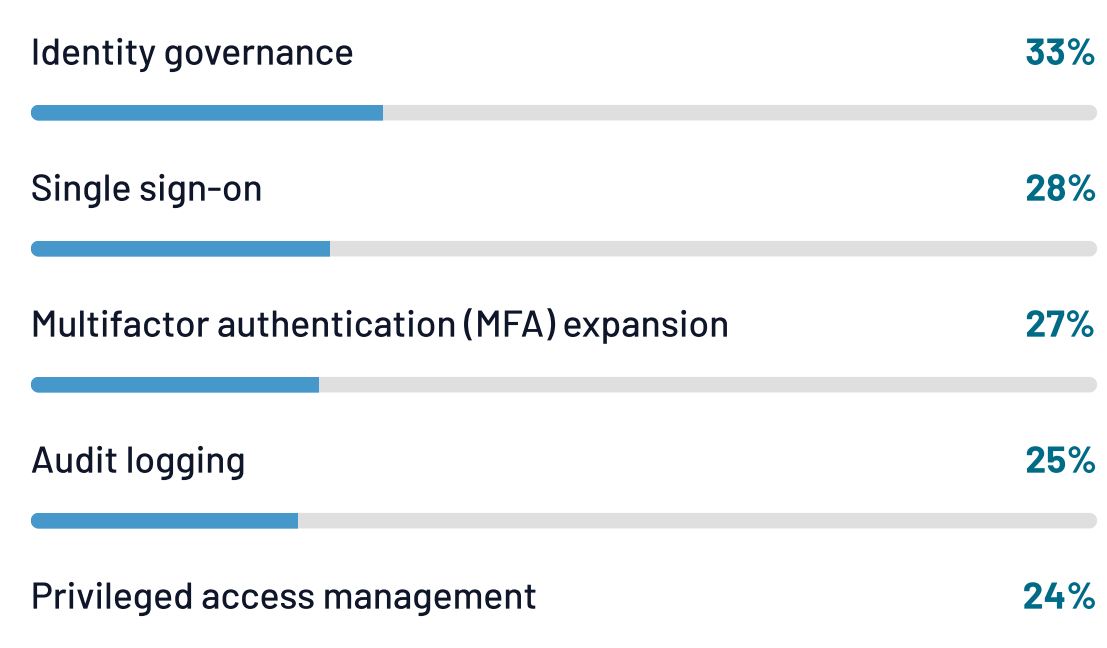
The Path Forward: Modern Identity Investment
